
Adult PICC/Ultrasound Workshop in Atlanta May 9-10, 2024

QUESTION

Are there absolute contraindications for PICCs, especially for deep vein thrombosis risk? How might this apply to quadriplegic patients?

ANSWER

There are a variety of studies that indicate an increased risk of thrombosis associated with insertion of a PICC with a patient having a history of thrombosis.

The best approach is to speak with the ordering physician and discuss the risk of thrombosis recurrence with the second PICC. In some cases the risk can be as high as 70% for recurrence in any other upper extremity vein (does not matter that the thrombosis is in another vein).

For quadriplegic patients selection of the best device depends upon the ongoing need for intravenous treatment. Use of PICCs for treatment over and over is problematic, with cost adding up over time: PICCs are designed for short to medium term treatment, not long-term or chronic treatment.

Circulation is impaired with quad patients making it a contraindication depending on the level of impairment. Patients with conditions that cause muscle atrophy and impaired use of an extremity typically also have poor circulation. Can these extremities be used for PIVs, Midlines or PICCs? The answer is yes, but risk of complications is definitely higher.

Knowledge of the contraindication is used to consider the safest type of vascular access device for the patient. Limitations and contraindications require the health care clinician to pause in thought, give consideration to the risk and possible complications and if necessary proceed with the PICC/Midline insertion with caution.
